

Quick -vs- Quickly (1 Answers)

*This sheet works with the differences
between **adjectives** and **adverbs**!*

Adjectives are generally used to modify (change) nouns

He is a very tall man. / He is very tall.

Adverbs are used to modify verbs by adding “ly”

We quietly walked into the room.

***If it ends in “y”, change it to “ily”*

Bob is an incredibly smart guy.
