Adjectives: Comparative (Answers)

Comparative adjectives are used when you have two or more things and want to talk about how they are different.

There are three kinds of comparative adjectives:

- 1. Ones that end in -er: big -bigger; happy -happier
- 2. Ones that start with *more*: expensive *more expensive*
- 3. Special ones: good better; bad worse
- *The best way to decide which to use is how long the adjective is.
 - **short adjectives generally end in -er
 - ** long adjectives generally start with more
