Borrow -vs-Lend (1 Answers)

to borrow means to get something for a short time. *It's free to use!

(borrow something from someone / borrow someone's something)

(borrow / borrowed / borrowed)

to lend means to give something for a short time. *It's free to use!

(lend something to someone / lend someone something)

(lend / lent / lent)

Students always borrow DVDs from me and never give them back!

Students always borrow DVDs from me and never give them back!

Students always borrow my DVDs and never give them back!

Could you lend Mary your jacket? She looks cold.

Could you lend your jacket to Mary? She looks cold.
