

Come -vs- Go (1 Answers)

Firstly, you have to think of the point of view of the speaker!!

We generally say: **Come “here”** when the speaker's is talking about a place he/she is at.

Come to my house for dinner.

(The speaker's point of view is he/she is at their house.)

We generally say: **Go “there”** when the speaker is talking about a different place from where he/she is at.

Let's go and see a movie tonight.

(The speaker's point of view is that he/she is not at the movie theater.)

11. I can't wait until my birthday comes !! With my birthday present money I plan to go snowboarding.
12. Julie loves to go dancing. She often comes to my dance club.
13. Are you going back home for Christmas, or is your family coming to Tokyo for Christmas? I really hope they come here!
14. It's getting late. I have to go home. Mom will get mad if I don't come home by 7:00.
15. I can't decide which university to go to. If I go too far away, no one will come to see me.
16. It's surprising when you hear how many people go to Roswell, New Mexico every year to see the aliens that have come to Earth.
17. Peter, come here. I want to show you something amazing.
