

No -vs- Not (1 Answers)

*This sheet deals with using **no** and **not** with the verbs be and have:*

No + (noun);(adj - noun)

*No (thing/where/one/body)

She **has** no *friends* yet in her new town. (Sue knows no *one* here.)

Bob **has** no *close family* in town.

Not + (adjective/verb(ing))

*Not (many/much/any)

I'm not *interested* in it yet.

There **is** not *much* left to do.

John **is** not *joining* our club.

Not + (a noun - singular)

*Not one's noun

There **was** not *a house* standing after the tornado.

This **is** not Kim's wallet.

*Choose **no** or **not** for the following sentences:*

1. Tom's having a party, but I'm not going! It will probably be boring because there will be no one I know there.
2. I hope there is no snow this winter! Too much fell last year!
3. I had no money and no where to live when I came to Tokyo.
4. This is not my notebook. Mine has no stickers on it!
5. Tomoko is not happy about having to move to Ohio. It is not a cool place to live!
6. No one is answering the telephone. I hope it is not important.
7. We had absolutely no food left in our fridge after the 4th of July party.
8. *There are not many people at the museum. There is no one at the ticket gate and no line in front. It is probably not a good exhibition.
9. Mary had no chance to visit me when she came to Tokyo because she had no free time.
10. Mary had no chance to visit me when she came to Tokyo because she was not free.
11. Sherry has not seen the new Star Wars movie yet. Actually, she has no interest in Sci-fi movies.
12. There was not much work to do in the office today and no managers, so we just spent the day doing no work at all.
13. They say there's no thing anyone can do to stop climate change, and that it's not our problem. I do not agree with this!!
14. People who say there's not a thing anyone can do to stop climate change. I think they are just not interested in changing the way they live their lives.
