No + (noun);(adj - noun)

*No (thing/where/one/body)

She **has** no *friends* yet in her new town. (Sue knows no **one** here.)

Bob **has** no *close family* in town.

Not + (adjective/verb(ing))

*Not (many/much/any)

I'm not *interested* in it yet.

There **is** not *much* left to do.

John **is** not *joining* our club.

Not + (a noun - singular)

*Not one's noun

There **was** not *a house*
standing after the tornado.

This **is** not Kim's wallet.
