

So -vs- Because (3 Answers)

So: *A situation is happening, **SO** you do an action or get a result.*

The park doesn't have food, **so** I brought my lunch.

Because: *There is a reason or explanation **BECAUSE** of a situation.*

I brought my lunch **because** the event doesn't have food.

We lit some candles because it was too dark to see.

6. I need to get a part-time job because my salary is too low.

My salary is too low, so I need to get a part-time job.

7. It looks like it's going to rain , so you need an umbrella.

You need an umbrella because it looks like it's going to rain.

8. We couldn't eat the curry because it was way too spicy!

The curry was way too spicy, so we couldn't eat it.

9. I couldn't sleep for a week because the movie scared me a lot.

The movie scared me a lot, so I couldn't sleep for a week.

10. Brenda knows the manager , so we got free tickets.

We got free tickets because Brenda knows the manager.

11. I had never been to NY before , so I asked for help a lot.

I asked for help a lot because I had never been to NY before.

12. I brush my teeth after meals because I don't want cavities.

I don't want cavities, so I brush my teeth after meals.
