The old man. This just says there is a man and he is old. (Regular) *The old man had many great interesting stories.*

To use the superlative, you need to add things like: "in the world", "in history", "ever", etc. **The oldest man.** This needs to be followed by one of the expressions mentioned above:

That guy is **the oldest man** I have ever met. This is **the most dangerous** place in town.
