## I'm TOO lazy TO study! (1 Answers)

The pattern for this worksheet is that something is **too** adjective, so you are unable to do some action (verb).

ex.) You must be 21 to <u>drink</u> alcohol. <u>Young</u> Timmy is only 19.
Timmy is too young to drink alcohol .
