covered with hair *shaved off his hair* *dyed his hair*

did a favor *treated unfairly by cheating* *made a mistake*
14. Jerry **doubled over** in pain after being punched in the stomach.
fought back *quickly bent his body* *passed out*
15. The old man **ran over** my foot with his car and broke it!
drove speedily *quickly escaped* *drove on top of*
