## A 5-Dollar Car!? – Compound Adjectives (1)

This sheet deals with numbers + noun modifiers (changers):
These are called Compound Adjectives, which tell you about the noun
Is it a 5-dollar car or a 5 dollars car?

5 = <u>number</u> and **dollar** is the <u>modifier</u> and **car** is the <u>noun</u>
\*\*If the <u>noun</u> comes *after* the **number** and **modifier**,
then there is no "s" on the **modifier**.

Therefore, "a 5-dollar car" is correct.

\*\*If the <u>noun</u> comes *before* the **number** and **modifier**, then you may or may not need an "s" on the **modifier**. Therefore, "a car was 5 dollars" is correct.
