<u>A 5-Dollar Car!? !? – Compound Adjectives (2)</u>

This again deals with **numbers + modifiers (compound adjectives),** and **nouns.** *Remember that if the <u>subject noun</u> comes after the <u>number</u> and <u>modifier(changer)</u>, then no "s". ex.) I bought a car. It cost 5 dollars. I bought a 5-dollar car.
