Borrow – Lend – Rent (1 Answers)

to borrow means to get something for a short time. *It's free/No charge!

(you borrow something from someone / borrow someone's something)

to lend means to give something for a short time. *It's free/No charge!

(you lend something to someone / lend someone something)

to rent means to get or give something for a short time. *Must pay money!

- 1. John asked if I would <u>lend</u> him my grill for his 4th of July BBQ.
- 2. John wants to borrow my grill for his 4th of July BBQ because renting one is too expensive.
- 3. If you **borrow** something from someone, you ought to return it ASAP.
- 4. Don't ever <u>lend</u> Adam any money. He'll never pay you back.
- 5. It's not fair! I have to <u>rent</u> a tuxedo for \$100 for our big school formal dance, but Jill gets to just <u>borrow</u> an evening gown from her sister for free! Plus, I have to pay for dinner too! Ugh!
- 6. Welcome to my pool party. If anyone forgot to bring a swimsuit, my wife or I can **lend** you one. We have plenty of suits here.
- 7. If you **borrow** my car, please fill it with gas when you're done.
- 8. I forgot to go to the ATM this morning. Could you <u>lend</u> me a couple of dollars so I can buy lunch?
- 9. With streaming services, I don't think anyone <u>rents</u> DVDs anymore.
- 10. Can we stop off at the library? I want to **borrow** some books.
- 11. Fred joined an Air B&B service and now <u>rents</u> his house to people on holidays. Then he just <u>rents</u> a cheap hotel room when they come.
- 12. Julie had an extra laptop, so she <u>lent</u> it to me until I got my own.
- 13. Mark is always <u>lending</u> things to people, which almost never get returned to him. Unfortunately, he can never remember who <u>borrowed</u> them, so that he can't ask for his stuff back.
- 14. I let Rich **borrow** my skateboard for 10 minutes and he broke it!
- 15. With our new system, people <u>rent</u> smartphones for 2 years at a low cost, and then exchange them for new ones that they again <u>rent</u> for 2 years at a low cost. It's much cheaper than buying a new smartphone.
- 16. Sweden has a great bicycle-sharing program. Anyone can <u>borrow</u> a bicycle from anywhere and use it for a while. Then they park it somewhere else and leave it for someone else to <u>borrow</u>. And it's all free! There's no need to <u>rent</u> one from a shop or ask a friend to <u>lend</u> you one.
- 17. Do you have a sleeping bag you can <u>lend</u> me for my camping trip?

 I <u>rented</u> a tent and things from a shop, but forgot to get a sleeping bag.
- 18. Have you ever <u>lent</u> something to someone and never got it back?
- 19. Have you ever **borrowed** something and never gave it back?
- 20. Tom <u>lent</u> his girlfriend his credit card to buy one thing, but she bought a lot of stuff. He swears he will never let her <u>borrow</u> it again.
