

Both..and/Neither..nor/Either..or! (Answers)

You can pair the following combinations together:

1. **Both A and B** : (2 items) I like **both pizza and pasta**.
2. **Either A or B** : (1 item) I can go **either Sat. or Sun.**
3. **Neither A nor B** : (0 items) I **neither play nor watch** sports.

Finish the sentences with the information provided (as in the examples):

ex.1) We saw **both the movie and the musical** for Lion King.

(movie/musical-2 items) *The (2 items) tells you which pattern to use*

ex.2) I **neither** want to **date nor get married** ever! (date/get married -0)

1. You can have **either chicken or fish** . (chicken/fish -1 item)
2. Sue ordered **both meat and fish** . (meat/fish – 2 items)
3. You should definitely **neither eat nor drink** before any surgery! (eat/drink – 0 items)
4. Most people prefer **both spring and fall** to the other seasons. (spring/fall – 2 items)
5. **Neither the USA nor Italy** qualified for the 2018 soccer World Cup. (the USA/Italy – 0 items)
6. I met **both Amy and Mark** in Bali. (Amy/Mark – 2 items)
7. Tom didn't come meet us and **neither phoned nor mailed** to say why! (phoned/mailed – 0 items)
8. You must **either take out the trash or do the dishes** before you can go out. (take out the trash/do the dishes – 1 item)
9. Antonio is **either from Spain or from Mexico** . I'm not sure. (from Spain/from Mexico – 1 item)
10. Greg played **both soccer and baseball** when in college. (soccer/baseball – 2 items)
11. *Sam **neither** wishes to **see nor talk** to me ever again, after I cheated on her. (see/talk – 0 items)
12. I can speak **both French and German** . (French/German – 2 items)
13. ** **either you tell** Ms. Smith that you lied, **or I will** ! (you tell/I will – 1 item)
14. **Neither you nor Jack** are good enough to marry my young daughter!! (you/Jack – 0 items)
15. The flowers are from **either Bob or Steve** . I can't remember who sent them! (Bob/Steve – 1 item)
