

I wasn't EXPECTING it to rain today! (1)

*This sheet deals with the different uses of the word **expect***

Expect, here, is used when one is *waiting for* or *thinking* of something
*Rewrite the sentences below, using **expect** in the correct form:*

ex. 1) It's raining and I don't have an umbrella because I didn't **think** it *would* rain today.

I don't have an umbrella because I wasn't **expecting** it to rain today.

1. It's cold now and I don't have a jacket. I didn't **think** it would be so cold.

2. It snowed yesterday and I didn't buy a shovel to move the snow. I didn't **think** it would snow so much.

3. Sue is pregnant and will have a baby. She is **waiting for** her baby to come any day now. (*very soon*)

4. Someone is knocking on my door, but I am not **waiting for** anyone.

5. Living in LA is much more expensive than I **thought** it would be.

6. Kim's friend brought cookies to the party, but she **thought** he would bring cake.

7. The long meeting just ended. It went later than I **thought** it would go.

8. The police don't **think** there will be any trouble at the soccer match.

9. I keep checking my email because I'm **waiting for** an important message.

10. Anne is staying at home today because she is **waiting for** a delivery.

11. I don't **think** the party will be any fun because I won't know anyone there.
