5. I've met many famous people, but meeting President Obama is one person that I was excited the most to meet. (*instead of “by”, use “about”*)

6. Our team has lost many, many games, but losing the championship game disappointed me the most.

7. I have seen many live musicals, but *Phantom* is the one that moved me the most.
