In case (1 Answers)

In case is often used in situations where something that is unexpected or unplanned might happen, so you want to be prepared. (Just in case is when the unexpected thing is really not expected)

I brought an umbrella with me because it might rain later. <u>I brought an umbrella with me in case it rains later.</u>

- 1. I keep important numbers in my bag because I might lose my phone one day. <u>I keep important numbers in my bag because in case I lose my phone one day.</u>
- 2. You should take a jacket because it might get cold later tonight. You should take a jacket in case it gets cold later tonight.
- 3. I'll give you my number because you might get lost coming to my house. <u>I'll give you my number in case you get lost coming to my house.</u>
- 4. I keep extra money in my phone case because I might forget my wallet one day. <u>I keep extra money in my phone case in case I might my wallet one day.</u>
- 5. Schools practice earthquake drills because a big quake might hit one day. Schools practice earthquake drills in case a big quake hits one day.
- 6. People must have car insurance because they might get into a car accident. **People must have car insurance in case they get into a car accident.**
- 7. Sue bought a wedding dress on sale now because she might get married one day. Sue bought a wedding dress on sale now in case she gets married one day.
- 8. Many trucks carry special tire chains for snow as it might snow suddenly. <u>Many trucks carry special tire chains for snow in case it snows suddenly.</u>
- 9. I have an extra charger for my iPhone because the battery might die. <u>I have an extra charger for my iPhone in case the battery dies.</u>
- 10. All cars have spare tires because they might get a flat tire one day. All cars have spare tires in case they get a flat tire one day.
- 11. I always back up my files because my PC might suddenly crash one day.

I always back up my files in case my PC suddenly crashes one day.
