In case (2 Answers)

In case is often used in situations where something that is unexpected or unplanned might happen, so you want to be prepared. (<u>Just in case</u> is when the unexpected thing is really not expected)

- ex.) I brought an umbrella with me because it might rain later.

 I brought an umbrella with me in case it rains later
- 1. I'll leave early to go to the meeting because there might be train trouble.

 I left early to go to the meeting in case there was train trouble
- 2. Mom packed some snacks because we might get hungry on the long drive.

 Mom packed some snacks in case we get hungry on the long drive.
- 3. I'll remind you with an email because you might forget about the party.

 I'll remind you with an email in case you forget about the party.
- 4. You should bring some mosquito spray 'cuz there might be mosquitoes! You should bring some mosquito spray in case there are mosquitoes!
- 5. Tina always carries bandages with her because she might cut herself.

 Tina always carries bandages with her in case she cuts herself
- 6. We should leave early, as there might be traffic on the way to the airport.

 We should leave early in case there is traffic on the way to the airport.
- 7. Greg keeps extra clothes in his car because his might get dirty at work.

 Greg keeps extra clothes in his car in case his get dirty at work.
- 8. Mary hides a spare house key under her doormat 'cuz she might lose her key.

 Mary hides a spare house key under her doormat in case he loses her key.
- 9. I'm allergic to bees, so I carry medicine 'cuz I might get stung by a bee.

 I'm allergic to bees, so I carry medicine in case I get stung by a bee.
- 10. Bring some sunscreen because the sun might be really strong at the beach.

 Bring some sunscreen in case the sun is really strong at the beach.
- 11. I brought some DVDs to the cabin because they might not have wi-fi.

 I brought some DVDs to the cabin in case they don't have wi-fi.
- 12. Kim keeps extra contact lenses in her bag because one of the ones she is wearing might pop out of her eye.

Kim keeps extra contact lenses in her bag in case one of the ones she is wearing might pop out of her eye .
