

Not Anything (1 Answers)

I was busy and didn't eat ANYTHING. (1 Answers)

This expression is used to say that not any(thing, one, where, etc.) happened, was met, etc. when talking about something that occurred.

- ex.) Bill turned on the TV, but didn't watch anything. (watch)
ex.) There was a big fight, but the police didn't arrest anyone. (arrest)

Not ANY (noun)

This part is for when you want to say you don't have any (noun)

- ex.) I didn't have any friends when I moved to Japan. (have friends)
1. Alex didn't have any money after he left Las Vegas. (have money)
 2. I was so busy that I didn't eat any food all day today. (eat food)
 3. Cal went fishing, but (he) didn't catch any fish. (catch fish)
 4. Ed is lazy and (he) doesn't give any help with housework. (give help)
 5. Rod fell down the stairs, but didn't break any bones. (break bones)
