Put on - Take off - Wear (1 Answers)

*Anything "<u>on</u>" your body: Clothes, jewelry, make up, perfume, etc. **Put on/Take off** are just quick one moment **actions**.

(put, put, put): (take, took, taken)

I put on a pair of jeans this morning. (Just a quick action)

When Kim got home, she took off her school uniform.

Wear is not an action, but just the situation of something on one's body.

Usually for a long period of time. (wear, wore, worn)

Ed almost always wears socks when he sleeps. (This is no action)

- 1. The *Lion King* actor **__put on**_ his costume and went out to perform on stage.
- 2. You should <u>take off</u> your hat when eating dinner! It's bad manners not to.
- 3. What perfume are you <u>wearing</u>? It smells great!
- 4. Bill took off his wedding ring at the gym and now can't find it. He's afraid to tell his wife that he lost it when she asks why he isn't wearing it.
- 5. Some people <u>wear</u> too much perfume and cologne. I can't breathe around them.
- 6. Pete <u>put on</u> his coat, and went to play out in the snow. His mom said to make sure he <u>takes off</u> his boots before coming back into the house.
- 7. Some girls rudely **<u>put on</u>** their make up while riding the trains.
- 8. Everyone knows that Japanese don't <u>wear</u> shoes in their houses. But in America, we usually <u>put on</u> our shoes in our bedrooms and <u>wear</u> our shoes around the house. We <u>take them off</u> before going to bed.
- 9. I wore a Santa suit for last year's Christmas party. It looked great!
- 10. If Sue <u>takes off</u> her glasses, she can't see anything. But she refuses to <u>wear</u> contact lenses.
- 11. The police **<u>put handcuffs on</u>** the man that they arrested for the robbery.
- 12. Kids can't go to arcades if they are <u>wearing</u> their school uniforms.
- 13. You must <u>take your jewelry off</u> at public swimming pools for safety.
- 14. I forgot to **<u>put on</u>** my belt this morning, so my pants are too loose!
- 15. I forgot to <u>wear</u> my belt (to work) today, so my pants are too loose!
- 16. The nurse said to <u>take off</u> my clothes and <u>put on</u> a hospital robe.
- 17. Julie is a natural beauty and doesn't need to <u>wear</u> any make-up. But if she decides to <u>put on</u> make-up to go to an event she looks amazing!

Sometimes we need to put things in our bodies. In these cases, we use:

- ** Put in / take out; These are for things that we actually put "in" our bodies: Contacts, earrings (pierced), etc.
- 1. I fell asleep and forgot to <u>take out</u> my contact lenses again. I know it's not good to <u>wear</u> the lenses when I sleep, so I better not do it again.
- 2. The old man has to <u>put in</u> his hearing aid so he can hear you.
- 3. Betty, you should <u>take out</u> your heavy earrings before we go jogging.
