Quick -vs- Quickly (1 Answers)

This sheet works with adjectives and adverbs!

<u>Adjectives</u> are generally used to modify (change) nouns She is a very <u>beautiful</u> woman. / She is very <u>beautiful</u>. <u>Adverbs</u> are used to modify verbs or other adjectives by adding "ly" We <u>quietly</u> snuck into the movie theater. When modifying adjectives, the adverb tells you "how adjective" the situation is: Tom is <u>incredibly</u> rich. (How rich is Tom? -Incredibly rich!) **If the adjective ends in "y", change it to "ily" The children <u>happily</u> played in the park. **If the adjective ends in "e", delete it and change it to "ly" Bob is an amazingly smart guy.

- 6. The teacher shouted <u>loudly</u> over the <u>loud</u> students. (loud/loud)
- 7. The artist played the piano and sang really <u>beautifully</u>. (beautiful)
- 8. That restaurant is <u>delicious</u> and <u>cheap</u>. (delicious/cheap)
- 9. The helicopter pilot flew <u>dangerously</u> close to the tall buildings. (dangerous)
- 10. Everyone was <u>silent</u> when the bride walked into the church. (silent)
- 11. Since their <u>wonderful</u> wedding day, Eric and Melanie have been very <u>happily</u> married for 55 years. (wonderful/happy)
- 12. Some of these new video games are way too violent for kids. (violent)
- 13. You should act more <u>carefully</u> while driving. (careful)
- 14. The students <u>silently</u> took their tests, because the teacher wanted <u>complete</u> silence during the test. (silent/complete)
- 15. The starving man <u>hungrily</u> ate his food. (hungry)
- 16. A Ferrari is an <u>extremely</u> fast car. (extreme/fast)
- 17. The mother <u>gently</u> brushed her baby's <u>soft</u> hair. (gentle/soft)
- 18. Everyone <u>cheerfully</u> sang the Christmas songs. (cheerful)
- 19. Only five students <u>correctly</u> answered the question. (correct)
- 20. Only five students gave the <u>correct</u> answer to the question. (correct)
