1. **comfort comforting comfortable comfortably** *(basic meaning: being physically relaxed with no pain or having most things you need in life)*

Our shoe company has invented a <u>comfortable</u> new style of hiking boot. The <u>comfort</u> of this boot is unmatched by any other boot. This boot fits <u>comfortably</u> and safely around your foot and ankle, which is very <u>comforting</u> to know when you're out hiking.

2. interesting interest interested interested interested interesting is special, unusual, etc.)

The <u>interest</u> generated by a possible COVID-19 vaccine has caused many people to no longer be <u>interested</u> in social distancing. More <u>interestingly</u>, some have even stopped wearing masks altogether. It will be <u>interesting</u> to see if new cases start to really increase.

3. surprisingly surprise surprising surprised surprising (unexpected things that suddenly happen or suddenly appear) surprised

It came as a big <u>surprise</u> to us all when Henry was <u>surprisingly</u> fired. But what <u>surprised</u> us the most was the reason why he was let go. It was <u>surprising</u> to hear that he had been stealing money from the company for years!

4. protection protective protectively protectively (make sure something is safe and doesn't get injured/damaged/etc) protect

This special group is a <u>protective</u> group whose only job is the <u>protection</u> of the President of the US. They <u>protect</u> the President whenever he travels and will <u>protectively</u> guard the President with their lives.

5. **embarrassing embarrassed embarrass embarrassment** (a feeling of shame or shyness (red-faced) in front of other people)

It was a major <u>embarrassment</u> when the video display failed to work at the exhibition. I was <u>embarrassed</u>, but it was very <u>embarrassing</u> for my company. We depend on having a good exhibition to increase sales. I never want to <u>embarrass</u> my company like that again!
