1. **amazement**                      **amazing**                      **amazingly**                      **amaze**  
(basic meaning: surprising in a way that makes you feel pleasure or admiration)

They say that the next generation smart phones will amaze everyone. They have amazingly added things we thought were impossible. These amazing new functions left everyone at the demonstration event in amazement.

2. **effectively**                      **effect**                      **effective**                      **effectiveness**  
(getting a positive result from something that you were hoping for)

We know that effective marketing has a major effect on consumer spending. To effectively sell any product, TV and radio advertisements need to capture consumer interests. The true effectiveness of this can easily be seen in increased sales,

3. **disappoint**                      **disappointingly**                      **disappointed**                      **disappointment**

(think something is good and acceptable to someone)

We are awaiting approval from the city for our outdoor music festival. If the city approvingly accepts our request for the festival, it will be a first, as they've never approved of one before. Approving the festival will be a major win for all music fans!

5. **significantly**                      **significant**                      **signify**                      **significance**  
(large or important enough to have some effect or be noticed)

We have seen a significant increase in sales since the launch of our new product. This product has significantly increased our customer base. Our higher profits signify the significance of our place in this market.
