This sheet deals with telling someone that something has been done

The pattern is: **have already + p.p. verb**

Would you like to order?

-Thanks, but **I've already ordered.**

Answer the questions as in the example with **have already p.p.verb:**

ex.) Do you want to see the new Star Wars movie? (see)

I have already seen it.

Do you want to:

1. eat at that new restaurant in the shopping mall? (go there)

2. eat lunch somewhere? (eat)

3. get married? (marry)

4. make that new recipe we saw on TV? (make it)

5. go see the King Tut exhibition at the museum? (see it)

Don't forget to:

1. pay your phone bill today! (pay it)

2. sign the contract! (sign it)

3. buy eggs today. (buy them)

4. do your homework before playing. (do it)

5. call your mom for Mother's Day. (call her)

6. clean your bedroom! (clean it)

Be sure to:

1. turn off the stove after you finish cooking. (turn it off)

2. write your name on your homework. (write it)

3. return the DVDs on your way to work. (return them)

4. fill the car up with gas when you are done. (fill it up)

5. take the spicy seeds out of the chili pepper. (take them out)

Shall we:

1. plant those carrot seeds? (plant them)

2. do our laundry together? (do it)

3. choose a place for our summer vacation? (chose one)

4. hire a limousine for the wedding? (hire one)

5. ask our teacher for some help? (ask her)

Why don't we:

1. find a place for Nancy's surprise party together. (find one)

2. plan Nancy's surprise birthday party together. (plan it)

3. buy a present for Nancy together. (buy one)

4. create a party guest list for Nancy's party. (create one)

5. decide the menu for Nancy's party together! (decide it)
