This is to say that you were **doing** some activity **when** something else happened

The event happened in the past, but when it did, you were doing some action. So, you need: <u>verb-ing...when...</u>

ex.) I took a shower last night. You called me at that time.

<u>I was taking a shower when you called.</u>
