*When you are **looking forward to doing something**,
you are really excited to do it.*

be **looking forward to** Verb-ing (I'm looking forward to going to Guam.)

*Sometimes you can use a noun (I'm looking forward to summer)

ex.) Summer is coming and you are very excited about it.

I'm looking forward to (enjoying) summer!

ex.) I have to go to the doctor for a health check-up. (not excited)

I'm not looking forward to going to the doctor for a check-up!
