Too adjective to verb (2)

I'm TOO lazy TO study!

The pattern for this worksheet is that something is **too adjective**, so you are unable to do some action (**verb**).

ex.) You must be 21 to <u>drink</u> alcohol. <u>Young</u> Timmy is only 19. Timmy is too young to drink alcohol.
Rewrite the sentences below using too adjective to verb:
1. The shop is really <u>far</u> . It would take 3 hours to <u>walk</u> there.
2. It was very <u>cloudy</u> last night, so we couldn't <u>see</u> the eclipse.
No more hints! (Just find the adjective and main verb!)
3. The construction work was so noisy that I couldn't sleep.
4. The old roller coaster is really dangerous, so we can't ride it.
5. I couldn't hear the teacher. She was speaking so quietly.
6. A new smartwatch is so expensive! I can't buy one right now.
7. My new fridge is really heavy and I can't carry it up the stairs.
8. We arrived at Disneyland so early that we couldn't enter it.
9. I played golf, but it got dark and I couldn't finish the round.
A little more difficult!
10. With no air conditioner, our classroom is so hot that we can't concentrate!
11. At the beach, the sand was so hot that we couldn't walk on it without shoes and the water was so cold we couldn't swim. (2 parts)
12. The hotel staff said Disneyland was very far and we couldn't walk there.
