*These are used for things that have a start, a middle and an end point*

**(at) the beginning of \* : (in) the middle of \* : (at) the end of \***

- : \* can be:
1. the day, the week, the month, the year
  2. Monday/July/2018 (these are names, so “the” is not used)
  3. the movie/the book/one's life/one's trip/etc.
  4. Star Wars/Tom’s speech/etc. (these are names, so “the” is not used)

*Tell when these events happen using at/in the beginning, middle, end of:*

**ex.1) Rich's birthday is at the end of December. (Dec. 31)**

**ex.2) 12 O'clock p.m. is in the middle of the day.**
